Current benefit amounts and eligibility criteria are outlined on the website. A veteran may receive both a HISA grant and either a SHA or SAH grant.

Department of Veteran's Affairs-Specially Adapted Housing (SAH)

This VA grant is only for veterans and service members with specific service-connected disabilities, to provide barrier-free living. They may be able to build or modify a home to fit their needs.

Department of Veteran's Affairs-Special Home Adaptation Grant (SHA)

This VA grant is for veterans and service members with specific service- connected disabilities, allowing for the modification of an existing home.

Department of Veteran's Affairs-Automobile Adaptive Equipment (AAE)

Provisions are available for adaptive automobile equipment to veterans for modified vehicles and lifts.

Fair Housing Act of 1968

States that tenants have the rights to make reasonable modifications to their homes with the permission of the landlord, but at the expense of the tenant.
